MARKET NEWS; St. John Gets a New Look

With the winter season approaching, St. John is looking green and lush and Cruz Bay is getting a facelift for the holidays! The roundabout construction is to the point that there really is a "roundabout" in place (although construction is still on going all around). Paving has started on the North Shore Road from Mongoose Junction going east that will give that beautiful drive a beautiful feel and the signage is up for the projected paving on the South Shore Road, from Marketplace all the way to Centerline Road.

The businesses in Cruz Bay are going for the new look too. La Tapa totally repainted during the summer and Connections has refreshed their bright scheme. There is a new security fence around the Creek apron area that gives a much more finished feel for cruise ship arrivals and passengers departing to the BVI.

Caneel closed for two months this fall, giving them plenty of time for updating and a fresh look after their last season of welcoming familiar guests and new celebrities. Angelina Jolie, Brad Pitt and Eli Manning were among those reportedly sighted.

St. John is GOING "GREEN"

The island is exceptionally green this year in more ways than one... RECYCLING has finally come to St. John! Cans can now be dropped off at convenient recycling bins adjacent to dumpsters. The ST. JOHN RECYCLING COUNCIL has volunteers pick them up and transport them to St. Thomas. For more info call Paul Devine at (340) 693-9410 or attend monthly meetings 7 pm on 2nd Tuesdays of the month on 3rd floor at The Marketplace near "Baked in The Sun".

Holiday Homes is also on the GREEN bandwagon. With our recent acquisition of a state of the art scanner we are digitizing all files and storing them in cyberspace. Our 50 years of historical archives can now be preserved indefinitely and we are much better able to transmit data by email thus saving trees and progressing toward a "paperless office". St. John MLS has also gone digital so now listings are processed and stored digitally. Agents can easily access data from their home offices and even on their mobile phones. We are the future! If you wish to be updated automatically by email when new listings within your search/interest parameters come on the market please let us know and be sure we have your current email address. Our website also has a search feature within MLS to see all new listings within the past 7 days.

Also our agents are taking classes online to get the new NAR "Green" designation and, as usual, are in the forefront of Realtor® education! In addition we are also members of The Island Green Building Association (IGBA) and are thrilled to announce that builders and architects here have established guidelines for building green. Please join with us to help protect and preserve the spectacular natural beauty, unique - but extremely fragile ecosystems, and enduring traditional culture that are the fabric of St. John. Be a part of the solution and discuss with your architect/builder The 10 Most Important Issues about building responsibly on St. John as listed on the IGBA website www.igba-stjohn.org. In its continuing effort to promote sustainable and environmentally responsible development and construction in the U. S. Virgin Islands IGBA has developed a "Tropical Green Building" Certification (TGBC) Program. There are also new resources available for cost effective green building with "eco panels" and bamboo. Please check out the websites www. ecosmartinc.com/ecoarchives.htm and www.bambooislandhome.com for more information. Prices start at \$60 per sq. ft. for the bamboo building system.

In some ways Virgin Islanders have been ahead of the movement for years with cisterns for water recycling and solar hot water heaters. Our environment is conducive being green with year round sun and constant breezes facilitating solar power and wind mills (TUTU Shopping center on St. T. now has 2 windmills powering that complex!) and some smart homeowners are now using net metering to reduce or eliminate VI Power and Water Authority (WAPA) electricity bills. Their solar panels make power that is combined at the meter with the utility provided power and the bill reflects the net difference. In addition WAPA, which has been researching an alternative to burning oil, has signed agreements to purchase power from the Alpine Energy Group two soon to be built waste-to-energy power plants in the territory. They will burn trash provided via an agreement with the VI Government Waste Management

Authority which will also help reduce the volume of solid waste that gets deposited in our landfills. The plants will reportedly burn approximately 146,000 TONS of trash a year!

Last but not least, the federal government has extended the 30% tax credit for the next 8 years and the VI Government is using American Recovery and Revitalization Act (ARRA) or "stimulus" funds to promote solar power for uses such as water heaters, pool pump circulation, and solar assisted air conditioning. They are training local workers and the energy office is expanding the Rebate Program (check out website www.vienergy.org).

That's lots of GOOD NEWS for the island!
