CREEPY CRAWLERS

Scooped-out mini pumpkins become spidery votives, with the help of tealights and pipe cleaners.



GHOSTLY GALLERY

Turn a mantel into a ghostly gallery by photocopying 19th century portraits (try using history books) and mounting them on sombre, coal-coloured mats.



EERY ENTRY

Choose an appropriately-sized pumpkin for your entry table. Carve out a small hole in the top that will hold the branch(es). Use patterned Halloween paper and cut out bat shapes. Tape a thin ribbon from the back of each bat and tie onto the branches.

Using a black permanent marker, draw ghost faces onto clean 4 litre milk jugs (tip: leave the caps on the jugs while you do this so they don't dent). With a craft knife, cut a loonie-sized hole in the back of each jug. Arrange the jugs close to each other & string the lights between them, stuffing several bulbs into each jug.

Garden Fall Maintenance Checklist

- Remove annuals & any dead plants from garden beds
- Place mulch around all trees, shrubs & perennials to protect the roots from freezing
- Plant spring bulbs (e.g. daffodils, tulips, & crocus) & fall bedding plants (e.g. pansies, mums & kale)
- Tropical plants should be wrapped or brought indoors
- Give your lawn a final mowing & rake it to remove any leaves & other debris
- Apply lime & winter (slow-release) fertilizer to your lawn
- Trim any trees, shrubs & plants away from the roof, siding and foundation
- Drain and/or winterize outdoor pools, garden hoses, and underground sprinkler systems
